### Active Learning Observed

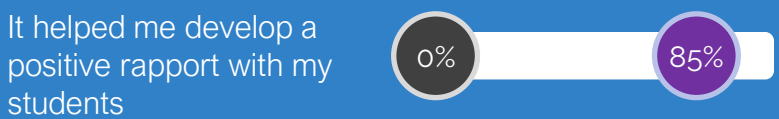
Percent of courses classified as using active learning based on classroom observations

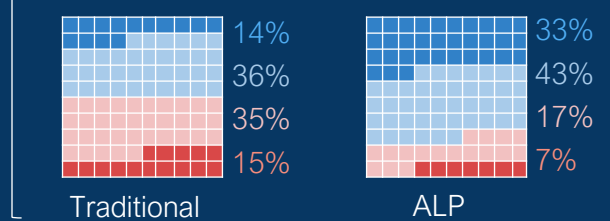


### Student Engagement

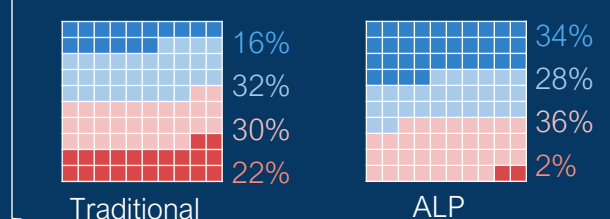
Percent of students who indicate they engaged in the activities below for the following reasons:

- I chose not to do this

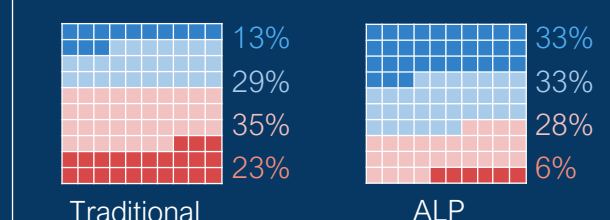
#### IDENTIFIED CLEAR LEARNING OUTCOMES



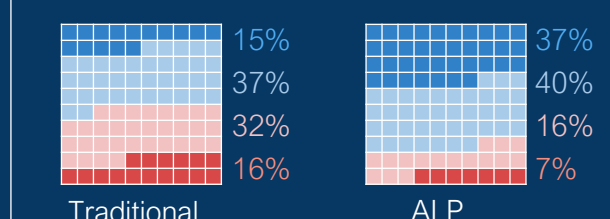
#### ANSWERED QUESTIONS USING POLLING TOOLS
